

President's Message

One thing that has become very clear through these five projects is the strong interest in Dundee for more tree planting. While the Re-Tree Midtown project has been a great benefit to our neighborhood, we still have a tremendous need for additional plantings. Because of the strong interest I have received for expanding our plantings, DMPA is going to look at possibly taking this type of project on our own. There are many obstacles that will need to be overcome, not the least of which is finding funding for such a project. We have a large neighborhood with many desirable locations for tree plantings. There is no question that such a project would cost at least \$100,000 based on what the costs have been for the previous plantings. The first step will need to be a professional planting plan for each block in the neighborhood (minus the blocks that have already been planted) in order to get an idea of what our costs will be. Where we save significant money is having volunteer labor plant the trees which is no small undertaking. Our neighborhood is at an important crossroads as the aging Silver Maples reach the end of their life spans. We faced a similar situation in the 1960's when the

Elms were wiped out by disease. If we want to continue to have a great tree canopy, we will need a neighborhood-wide commitment.

Normally as we head into August we are looking forward to the annual Dundee Day celebration at the end of the month. Because of the renovation project in the Dundee Business District, this year's Dundee Day has been moved back to Saturday, September 28th. We normally have the best weather of the year in late September so hopefully we will not have the scorching heat we have had in past years for Dundee Day. Before you get worried how you will watch the Husker football game and be at Dundee Day at the same time, there is no Husker game on September 28th so you can spend the entire day in Downtown Dundee.

As always, if you have any neighborhood concern or issue, please do not hesitate to let me or any other board member know.

It's the seemingly simple repair jobs in an old house that can OLD HOUSE MECHANIC drive you crazy. (As my wife would say, "Short drive, huh?")

Take doors, for example. There doesn't seem to be much to them—a slab of wood pivoting on hinges. How complicated can that be? Actually, door geometry can be complex and at times downright frustrating. All the parts have to fit just right or maybe the door won't swing correctly, or perhaps the lock won't latch, or possibly you're having the same problem as Joe, a reader of this column:

Dear OHM,

When we moved into our house we decided to reverse one of the bathroom doors-re-hang it so it opened to the left instead of the right.

We took the hinges off, switched the knob mechanism (and disabled the lock so our little boy can't lock himself in) and mortised the hinges into the jamb on the opposite side. It hangs great and shuts, but the hinges seem to be "spring loaded" now, like there is a slight tension pushing back when we close the door. Nothing really binds or rubs that I can see and the door shuts and latches just fine, I just can't figure out what's up. Any ideas??

I enjoy the column in the DMPA newsletter-I always look to see if there's something I can use.


There are a couple of things I would look at on your door. One, is the door binding a little against the stop? The stop is the thin wood trim that limits the swing of the door,

hence the name stop. There should be a small gap between the door and the stop all the way around the full perimeter of the door. I use a matchbook cover to set the gap. To check this close the door and slip a matchbook cover between the door and the stop and then slide the cover all the way around the door. If it won't slide past any point, this is where it's binding. To correct the problem carefully pry the stop loose and then re-nail it in the proper position again using the matchbook cover to set the gap. Even a little binding can cause the "spring-loaded effect you are experiencing.



If the stop is okay, then the second place I'd look is at the hinge mortises. (The hinge-sized spaces chiseled into the doorframe.) If they are too shallow or too deep, this can also cause the door to spring back a little. Look closely at the hinges when they are closed. There should be a small gap between the hinge leaves. And when the door is open, typically the hinge leaves should be flush with the doorjamb. You can adjust the mortises by chiseling out a little wood if they are too shallow or shimming them out if they are too deep. A thin piece of cardboard cut to the size of the hinge leaf makes a good shim.


